## FORTH NATURALIST AND HISTORIAN

The Forth Naturalist and Historian (FNH) is a Registered Charity (SC013270). It was set up in 1975 by several University and Central Regional Council staff to provide a focus for activities and publications concerned with the environment, wildlife and history of the Forth Region. The journal covers the Stirling, Falkirk and Clackmannanshire local authority areas and the immediate hinterland. FNH is run by a committee of volunteers who organise and finance the annual journal as well as an annual conference. The committee is supported by a membership of around 50 and there is an AGM at the annual conference.

The volumes of the Journal provide a valuable successor to The Transactions of the Stirling Field and Archaeological Society which ran from 1878 to 1939. The editorial in the first 1976 volume FNH stated: “The aim in launching the Forth Naturalist and Historian is primarily to increase our knowledge of this neglected part of Scotland.” Since its inception over 520 articles and 47 volumes have been published. In 2022, the Board consulted on methods of publishing the Journal online, yet printing a limited number of paper copies for those who preferred them in that format. This hybrid version was used for the first time in Volume 47. An e-version can be ordered from the website for £5 and hard copies (subject to availability) for £17. Discounts apply to members – for current subscription rates see below.

The FNH website (address below) carries a complete title word index together with Volumes 1- 46 which are available on line. Hard copies can be found in local and national libraries, museums and archives and some of the last 20 volumes are still available for sale upon request.
